Things that matter most part 3 Our New Life in Christ

Series aim: After a we as sinners come to Christ we are faced the responsibility of living our new life in Christ. We literally become a new "species."¹ As such, life cannot continue as it did before, whereas we had our sin nature as a taskmaster and lived according to the passions and wishes of our sin nature, we now have a new Master, Christ. Life now is completely different - Paul the apostle says that we should live as dear children of God.² These issues of behaving as God's beloved children now become most important in our lives. As we can see from the outline below, this will be an ongoing topic covering more than a few classes and will probably not be a continuous series.

This probably will be framed in the context of a discipleship series rather than a technical approach with the view of challenging the mature to pass along these "important matters" to others including our children or grandchildren. To the young in Christ, this will hopefully be an opportunity to be challenged to mature in Him. Here is the series outline as I see it now. I reserve the right to change the outline as the Spirit leads.

 - What was a Bond slave?
 - What are our responsibilities as Bond slaves of Christ today?
 - Ministers. (May include an overview of the Levites,)
 - Ambassadors.

Final comments: Casting a shadow with our lives in Christ. This comes from our

study in Ecclesiastes³ where Solomon said of the godless that their lives would not cast a shadow. The word picture here is that of a long, sunny day where, at the end, long shadows are cast. Our lives should cast a shadow for Christ. Here is an excerpt from a previous lesson in the Ecclesiastes series:

"The shadow of our lives. Verse 13 uses a common experience from every day life - the shadow. Consider the paradox - in verse 12 wicked men sometime live to an old age seemingly without being punished by God - yet they cast no shadow. The implication is that the righteous do cast a shadow - make that a full and rewarding life. We should consider our legacies when at the end of our lives. We must ask the question - what has been my shadow - my legacy - have I lived a life that has counted for Christ? Has my life cast a shadow over the lives of others? It looked as though Paul, the apostle, was going to come to the end of his life - a criminal in the eyes of Roman law and yet he was able to say "I have fought the good fight, I have finished the race, I have kept the faith." (2 Tim. 4:7). His life had been dedicated to the preaching of the Gospel and the preparation of young men to carry on the good fight of faith and he offered no regrets for that life - Paul had cast a long shadow over the lives of other - he was the means of bringing many to Christ and was the leader of the defense of the Gospel in a cosmopolitan age of diversity of religions. Can we say the same thing - that our shadow have a long ones of influence in the lives of others for Christ?"
